With a focus on comedy off-camera, she has performed sketch and improv at the Groundlings, UCB, and Comedy Central Stage, and accepted invitations to appear at comedy festivals nationwide, including SketchfestNYC, Chicago Sketchfest, and the storied HBO U.S. Comedy Arts Festival in Aspen (winning the Best Sketch Comedy award with troupe Summer of Tears).



**Michelle Meyers** is a writer and educator originally from Los Angeles, CA. After finishing her MFA in Fiction at the University of Alabama, she joined the faculty of USC Dornsife's Writing Program. Her debut novel, Glass Shatters, was published by She Writes Press in 2016 and was selected as an Editor's Pick in Literary Fiction by Foreword Reviews. Michelle is a breast cancer survivor as well and is actively involved in developing opportunities for adolescent and young adult cancer survivors/thrivers to tell their stories.



**Zach Steel** is an assistant professor of theatre practice and head of comedy at the USC School of Dramatic Arts. He has been teaching at The Clown School in Los Angeles for three years and began teaching at the USC School of Dramatic Arts in the fall of 2014. He also serves as supervisor for SDA's new program in medical clowning, the practice of bringing highly skilled performers into hospitals. He has been a member of the theatre troupe Four Clowns since 2011, performing in multiple theatres in L.A., in São Paolo, Brazil, and taking his original, awardwinning show, Me Rich You Learn to The Telluride Playwrights Festival in Colorado. He has appeared on several television shows for NBC, Comedy Central and Fox.



**Mario Ybarra Jr.** is a Mexican-American conceptual artist born and raised in LA. His artwork examines excluded social norms, often examining complete environments, histories, and narratives. He received an MFA from UC Irvine and a BFA from Otis College of Art and Design. He has been featured in local, national, and international exhibitions/fairs, including the 2008 Whitney Biennial, the Tate Museum in London, the Orange County Museum of Art, Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego, MOCA Los Angeles, MOCA Detroit, the ICA Boston, Museo De Cervantez Spain, ARCO Fair 2011 and 2013, LACMA, the Art Institute of Chicago, among others. In 2002, in partnership with his wife Karla Diaz, he co-founded Slanguage (an artist-run space/collective in Los Angeles that hosted art exhibitions, residencies, and programming for youth and adults). He has been featured as a speaker in many national and international venues, most notably at the Creative Summit in New York & Art Pace San Antonio.
